COMMENTATORS

Dr. Howard Clark received a ThM from Dallas Theological Seminary and a PhD from Western Seminary. He served as pastor of several local churches and taught at Dallas Seminary.

Dr. William Counts received an AB from Princeton, an MA from Southern Methodist University, a ThM from Dallas Theological Seminary, and a DMin from Fuller Seminary. He served as a pastor for many years and authored three books: *Freedom from Guilt* (co-authored with Bruce Narramore), *The Incredible Christ*, and *Called to Be Free*.

Rev. Timothy Crater (deceased) was a graduate of Dallas Theological Seminary (ThM), where he received the Henry Thiessen Award in New Testament Studies. He served in pastoral ministry for many years, and he was an author and frequent speaker on the subject of America’s heritage of faith. He also served as special representative for the Office of Public Affairs of the National Association of Evangelicals in Washington, DC.

Dr. James Edwards is a professor of Religion at Whitworth College. He earned his MDiv from Princeton Theological Seminary and his PhD in New Testament from Fuller Theological Seminary. He is a contributing editor for *Christianity Today*, and he has done translation work for Wycliffe Bible Translators. He has written commentaries on Romans and the Gospel of Mark.

Rev. Phillip Hiller received his BA from St. Olaf College and earned a MA from the University of Wisconsin. He received his theological training at Luther Seminary and Princeton Seminary. He was ordained to the pastoral ministry and served parishes and schools as pastor, teacher, author, and administrator.

Dr. Doug McIntosh earned a ThM from Dallas Theological Seminary and an MDiv from Trinity Evangelical Divinity School. He pastors a church in Atlanta, GA, has taught Biblical Languages and Theology at Columbia Biblical Seminary Extension, has led tour groups to the Bible lands, and is a prolific author.

Dr. Erwin Rudolph has a BA in Theology from Greenville College, Illinois, an MA from Ohio State University, and a PhD in English Literature from the University of Illinois. Dr. Rudolph served pastorates in Ohio and Illinois before becoming a professor of English Literature at Wheaton College. After 31 years at Wheaton, he was named professor emeritus.

Dr. Sam Schultz (deceased) earned his ThD from Harvard Divinity School. He was a professor of Bible at Wheaton College for 30 years and led its Biblical Studies Department for 22 years. He wrote many books on the Old Testament, including *The Old Testament Speaks*. He served as a trustee of Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary.

Dr. Eddy Swieson received his LTh from Melbourne College of Divinity and his doctorate at Wesley Theological Seminary, Washington, DC. He also studied at George Washington University and the School of International Service of American University. He served as a pastor for many years.
